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General Information:

- Studies for SRN, Obstetrics and London University Diploma of Nursing at The Middlesex Hospital. Graduated 1972.
- Senior Diploma Staff Nurse running the ENT ward followed by
- Diploma Ward Sister running a busy general surgical floor. At weekends i/c the whole surgical wing.

Both consultants on my ward - Sir William Slack and Mr Cecil Murray – recommended I study Medicine, hence a place at Sheffield Medical School for training. Graduated 1981.

- Internships with Professor Richmond and his team which included Barry Hancock at Weston Park Hospital, then Mr Anthony Jefferson Neurosurgical team at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital.

After a spell in local General Practice I became a Senior Medical Officer with HM Tri-Service Medical Branch, seeing action in both hostile (Falklands, Eritrea, Arctic Circle, Gulf I, SAS, to name a few) and peace time postings, both in uniform and civilian capacities, where I gained much experience in dealing with *first line trauma*, e.g. plane crashes, war wounds, disasters as well as the routine side of general practice. I am an accredited VTS GP.

Smith & Nephew Foundation awarded me a Sports Medicine Scholarship studying at The London Hospital. Graduated 1988. I then moved into positions of Senior Medical Advisor to various International Sports Teams and ran a number of prestigious events held in the UK – World Gymnastics, Basketball, Netball, Athletics, Swimming. I practised for a number of years as an independent Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation Consultant.

The last few years I have become very interested in Complementary Medicine and have gained internationally recognised accreditations in Clinical Aromatherapy, Reflexology, Massage (various applications), Thermoauricular Therapy, Nutrition, Lymphoedema Massage Self Help Training for Patients, Reiki Master and Teacher.

Cancer Involvement:

Apart from meeting those challenges associated with a medical professional's involvement, my own cancer journey began in August 2002 with a chance finding, having been struck by lightning at a sports meeting – Ovarian cancer with metastatic spread necessitating extensive pelvic clearance and omentectomy followed by 6 months chemotherapy. I remained in remission until July 2008 when recurrence necessitated a second challenge with chemotherapy, currently ongoing.

I also cared for my mother at home during her last days with carcinomatosis – unknown primary.

NTCRP:

I became interested in the Panel after attending its Annual Conference 4 years ago and since then have tried to gain and share as much knowledge as possible with the group. Attendance at the NCRI Conferences in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008 have been very worthwhile, as reported in my summaries back to the group. Being a Fellow of the RSM has been helpful when gleaning further information to bring to

the NTCRP regarding cancer projects nationally and internationally. I was elected as the Vice Chair in April 2008.

Since being involved with the Panel, I represent the consumer perspective on the local Clinical Trials Executive Committee and the North Trent TSSG Gynae Group. Earlier this year I was approached to deliver a workshop session in London as part of the Cancer Roadshows across the UK, regarding Consumer Involvement in Cancer Research.
